## **Office of Motor Vehicles to Host “Senior Day” at Local Offices**

**BATON ROUGE** – As part of its continued commitment to better serve the citizens of Louisiana, the Office of Motor Vehicles is pleased to announce the implementation of a “Senior Day” pilot program to be held at local OMV offices across the state. The program is currently scheduled to take place one Saturday each month for the next six months aimed at providing senior citizens an expedited level of service by reducing and/or alleviating office wait times.

During the “Senior Day” program, strategically located OMV offices across the state will offer vehicle registration, driver’s license, identification card, handicap placard, and reinstatement services to those individuals 60 years of age and older.

The program is set to begin on Saturday, November 1, 2014 from 8:00 am until 12:00pm at the following Louisiana OMV locations:
